Il est possible d'associer ce boîtier conversion numérique analogique avec le boîtier de conversion analogique numérique ADC0803LCN 8 bits P70.31. Dans ce cas, il convient de se reporter également à la notice d'utilisation de ce dernier. Ces deux boîtiers seront reliés par des fils de connexions entres les sorties numériques DB0 à DB7 côté ADC0803LCN et les entrées numériques correspondantes A1 à A8 (LSB vers LSB; ...; MSB vers MSB) coté DAC0808LCN.

Si, pour la tension d'entrée à convertir, on applique une tension variable positive comprise entre 0 et 5 V max délivrée par un générateur de fréquence, il faudra donc régler l'offset du générateur. Prendre également soin de relier la masse de ce générateur avec la masse de l'alimentation continue 12 V du boîtier ADC0803LCN.

General Description


The DAC0808 is an 8-bit monolithic digital-to-analog converter (DAC) featuring a full scale output current settling time of 150 ns while dissipating only 33 mW with $\pm 5 V$ supplies. No reference current (I_REF) trimming is required for most applications since the full scale output current is typically ± 1 LSB of 255 I_REF/256. Relative accuracies of better than $\pm 0.19\%$ assure 8-bit monotonicity and linearity while zero level output current of less than 4 μA provides 8-bit zero accuracy for I_REF ≥ 2 mA. The power supply currents of the DAC0808 is independent of bit codes, and exhibits essentially constant device characteristics over the entire supply voltage range.

The DAC0808 will interface directly with popular TTL, DTL or CMOS logic levels, and is a direct replacement for the MC1508/MC1408. For higher speed applications, see DAC0800 data sheet.



Block and Connection Diagrams




Dual-In-Line Package






FIGURE 1. +10V Output Digital to Analog Converter (Note 8)


Logic Input Current vs Input Voltage

Logic Threshold Voltage vs Temperature






Output Current vs Output Voltage (Output Voltage Compliance)



Output Voltage Compliance vs Temperature




Typical Power Supply Current vs Temperature




Typical Power Supply Current vs V_{EE}





FIGURE 2. Equivalent Circuit of the DAC0808 Series (Note 8)

FIGURE 3. Notation Definitions Test Circuit (Note 8)




FIGURE 4. Relative Accuracy Test Circuit (Note 8)




FIGURE 5. Transient Response and Settling Time (Note 8)




FIGURE 6. Reference Current Slew Rate Measurement (Note 8)




FIGURE 7. Positive V_{REF} (Note 8)




FIGURE 8. Negative V_{REF} (Note 8)




FIGURE 9. Programmable Gain Amplifier or Digital Attenuator Circuit (Note 8)

Application Hints

REFERENCE AMPLIFIER DRIVE AND COMPENSATION

The reference amplifier provides a voltage at pin 14 for converting the reference voltage to a current, and a turn-around circuit or current mirror for feeding the ladder. The reference amplifier input currrent, I₁₄, must always flow into pin 14, regardless of the set-up method or reference voltage polarity.

Connections for a positive voltage are shown in Figure 7. The reference voltage source supplies the full current I_{14} .

For bipolar reference signals, as in the multiplying mode, R15 can be tied to a negative voltage corresponding to the minimum input level. It is possible to eliminate R15 with only a small sacrifice in accuracy and temperature drift.

The compensation capacitor value must be increased with increases in R14 to maintain proper phase margin; for R14 values of 1, 2.5 and 5 k Ω , minimum capacitor values are 15, 37 and 75 pF. The capacitor may be tied to either V_{EE} or ground, but using V_{EE} increases negative supply rejection.

A negative reference voltage may be used if R14 is grounded and the reference voltage is applied to R15 as shown in *Figure 8*. A high input impedance is the main

Application Hints (Continued)

advantage of this method. Compensation involves a capacitor to V_{EE} on pin 16, using the values of the previous paragraph. The negative reference voltage must be at least 4V above the V_{EE} supply. Bipolar input signals may be handled by connecting R14 to a positive reference voltage equal to the peak positive input level at pin 15.

When a DC reference voltage is used, capacitive bypass to ground is recommended. The 5V logic supply is not recommended as a reference voltage. If a well regulated 5V supply which drives logic is to be used as the reference, R14 should be decoupled by connecting it to 5V through another resistor and bypassing the junction of the 2 resistors with 0.1 μF to ground. For reference voltages greater than 5V, a clamp diode is recommended between pin 14 and ground.

If pin 14 is driven by a high impedance such as a transistor current source, none of the above compensation methods apply and the amplifier must be heavily compensated, decreasing the overall bandwidth.

OUTPUT VOLTAGE RANGE

The voltage on pin 4 is restricted to a range of -0.55 to 0.4V when $V_{EE} = -5V$ due to the current switching methods employed in the DAC0808.

The negative output voltage compliance of the DAC0808 is extended to -5V where the negative supply voltage is more negative than -10V. Using a full-scale current of 1.992 mA and load resistor of 2.5 k Ω between pin 4 and ground will yield a voltage output of 256 levels between 0 and -4.980V. Floating pin 1 does not affect the converter speed or power dissipation. However, the value of the load resistor determines the switching time due to increased voltage swing. Values of R_L up to 500Ω do not significantly affect performance, but a 2.5 k Ω load increases worst-case settling time to 1.2 μs (when all bits are switched ON). Refer to the subsequent text section on Settling Time for more details on output loading.

OUTPUT CURRENT RANGE

The output current maximum rating of 4.2 mA may be used only for negative supply voltages more negative than -8V, due to the increased voltage drop across the resistors in the reference current amplifier.

ACCURACY

Absolute accuracy is the measure of each output current level with respect to its intended value, and is dependent upon relative accuracy and full-scale current drift. Relative accuracy is the measure of each output current level as a fraction of the full-scale current. The relative accuracy of the DAC0808 is essentially constant with temperature due to the excellent temperature tracking of the monolithic resistor lad-

der. The reference current may drift with temperature, causing a change in the absolute accuracy of output current. However, the DAC0808 has a very low full-scale current drift with temperature.

The DAC0808 series is guaranteed accurate to within ±1/2 LSB at a full-scale output current of 1.992 mA. This corresponds to a reference amplifier output current drive to the ladder network of 2 mA, with the loss of 1 LSB (8 µA) which is the ladder remainder shunted to ground. The input current to pin 14 has a guaranteed value of between 1.9 and 2.1 mA, allowing some mismatch in the NPN current source pair. The accuracy test circuit is shown in Figure 4. The 12-bit converter is calibrated for a full-scale output current of 1.992 mA. This is an optional step since the DAC0808 accuracy is essentially the same between 1.5 and 2.5 mA. Then the DAC0808 circuits' full-scale current is trimmed to the same value with R14 so that a zero value appears at the error amplifier output. The counter is activated and the error band may be displayed on an oscilloscope, detected by comparators, or stored in a peak detector.

Two 8-bit D-to-A converters may not be used to construct a 16-bit accuracy D-to-A converter. 16-bit accuracy implies a total error of $\pm \frac{1}{2}$ of one part in 65,536 or $\pm 0.00076\%$, which is much more accurate than the $\pm 0.019\%$ specification provided by the DAC0808.

MULTIPLYING ACCURACY

The DAC0808 may be used in the multiplying mode with 8-bit accuracy when the reference current is varied over a range of 256:1. If the reference current in the multiplying mode ranges from 16 μ A to 4 mA, the additional error contributions are less than 1.6 μ A. This is well within 8-bit accuracy when referred to full-scale.


A monotonic converter is one which supplies an increase in current for each increment in the binary word. Typically, the DAC0808 is monotonic for all values of reference current above 0.5 mA. The recommended range for operation with a DC reference current is 0.5 to 4 mA.


SETTLING TIME


The worst-case switching condition occurs when all bits are switched ON, which corresponds to a low-to-high transition for all bits. This time is typically 150 ns for settling to within $\pm1/\!\!\!/2$ LSB, for 8-bit accuracy, and 100 ns to $1/\!\!\!/2$ LSB for 7 and 6-bit accuracy. The turn OFF is typically under 100 ns. These times apply when $R_L \leq 500\Omega$ and $C_O \leq 25$ pF.

Extra care must be taken in board layout since this is usually the dominant factor in satisfactory test results when measuring settling time. Short leads, 100 μ F supply bypassing for low frequencies, and minimum scope lead length are all mandatory.


